## RE: Festive period at school

I hope this letter find you well. The festive period at school has already started and we are finding ways to make the build up to Christmas as exciting as possible for the children. I am sure you will agree that this has been a year like no other for not only the children, but for parents, carers and of course our staff who have worked tirelessly whether it be during the school day or, and quite often, at home, to ensure the children are provided with the best opportunities to maintain their learning whilst also safeguarding them during these Covid affected times. We recognise that children have missed playing with their friends in other year groups and their normal school assemblies and PE lessons. I know that they have been disappointed about postponed school trips and days out. However, I think that it is important to be positive and feel satisfied that together we have made the best of things. I have been proud of feedback from United Learning on how well our school community has adapted to operating under coronavirus restrictions and continued have also been touched by the support that we have received from you parents.

We also know that it has not been easy for you parents and carers and appreciate that the safety procedures that we have put into place at school are becoming very tiresome. However, it is extremely important for the health of us all that we remain focused and continue to adhere to measures that have been put in place - we thank you for bearing with us and for your continued support.
