Dear Parents/Carers

Thank you very much for the support that you are giving your children with their remote learning. We are aware that, as a parent, it is not easy to make sure that your children join all lessons and pay attention all of the time so we appreciate what you are doing.

Last week we had 80% attendance for our remote lessons across the school which is quite high for a primary school, but we would like all children to attend if possible so that they keep up with their learning. This letter is intended to help the remote lessons to run more smoothly. We have attached our remote learning expectations along with some other things to consider.

Live Virtual Lessons Expectations for Pupils

School Account	When you log in, you must use your school username and password otherwise you will not be admitted into the lesson.
Be on time	Be ready to join the lesson before the start time. Make sure you have everything you need and make sure that your device has sufficient charge.
Mute yourself	When you enter the lesson, click the mute icon. This helps minimise background noise. Do not turn the volume on again unless your teacher invites you to speak.

Camera on or off?	There will be times when your camera needs to be on and there will be times when you need to turn it off. Listen to your teacher and do what she/he tells you to
	do.
Eliminate distractions	Do your best to sit in a quiet place. Let your family know when you will be taking part in lessons so they can avoid interrupting you. Close all other tabs and windows unless they are needed for the lesson.
Neat presentation	Consider your background and clothing. Try to sit in a part of the house where people will not be walking through and make sure you are wearing something appropriate for school - no pjs!
Chat responsibly	Use the chat option to contribute to the lesson by writing comments and questions appropriate and relevant to the lesson.
Prepare to share	If your teacher asks you a direct question, then unmute your microphone and share your contribution with the class. You can also share your screen if requested by your teacher.
Take notes	Make sure you have a pencil/pen and paper ready to write down any notes or ideas and to help you stay focused.

- **Timetables:** The timetables for home learning can been seen on our website and on our Facebook page. We will alert you if they change.
- **Technical issues:** If your child has a technical issue, please don't disrupt the lesson to tell the teacher, just log off, try re-entering and if you are still having problems write in the text box or email the IT team on: computingcurriculum@thevictory.portsmouth.sch.uk
- **Parents:** We really appreciate the support that parents give their children to help them to stay on task, however, please can parents avoid joining in the lessons themselves e.g. by asking/answering questions. If you have a question, your child can type it in to the chat box.
- **Behaviour:** So far behaviour has been good. If a child's behaviour is disturbing a lesson or they are not following an expectation of online learning, the teacher will address it. If a child ignores warning sit may be that will be rebuked directly. If the behaviour continues, parents/carers will be contacted by telephone.
- **Refreshments:** Please avoid eating and drinking when the camera is on.
- **Resources** So far, we have distributed stationery including workbooks. On Friday we will start to distribute reading books for children up to year 3 and Maths equipment that will help support the home learning. For details of when you can pick up the materials check the school Facebook page or email: admin1@thevictory.portsmouth.sch.uk. Please make sure that the children treat the books and equipment with respect. The books, in particular, would be expensive to replace.
- **Feedback**: Feeding back to your child is an important part of your child's learning process. In order for your child's teacher to support your child's learning, please can you send them a photograph of your child's work via email at the end of their lesson. This will help your child's teacher see what your child has learnt and help them prepare for their next steps in learning.
- **Great job**: If your child really impresses you with an achievement at home, whether it is homework or another achievement, please photograph and email it to your child's teacher. We will choose some for Facebook and some to show in assembly.
- **Assembly:** Achievement assembly will take place at 1.45 on Fridays. The children will be sent a link. News of stars of the week will be posted on Facebook.

Half term holidays

The testing of school staff for Covid 19 is due to start next week. So far there is no news to suggest that primary age children will be routinely tested.
